

The History Major at Keene State College

The KSC History Department is known for its diverse and challenging courses. In addition we offer two innovative programs of special opportunities, an Honors Program and an Internship Program. .

In the **History Honors Program** students create their own independent research and writing projects and work closely with their supervising professors over the course of a year to bring their projects to completion.

The **History Department Internship Program** offers five exciting tracks. In partnership with nearby historical societies, KSC's Mason Library and Cohen Center, and the NH State Conservation and Rescue Archeology Program we offer the following:

1. Archeology. Join a crew excavating a NH archeological site and cataloging its artifacts for two to six weeks in the summer.
2. Archival Work. Catalog and digitize collections of artifacts such as photos, letters, and diaries and perhaps assist in developing a museum exhibit.
3. Advanced Archival Work. Train with a professional archivist and then work in a local archive.
4. Archival Work for the Classroom. Create lesson plans and curriculum kits for local schools using documents and artifacts.
5. Oral History. Learn how to conduct an oral history project and work in the oral history collection of an archive.

What KSC History alumni say about the History Department. In a recent survey of History alumni, 95% said they used skills they had learned as a History major in their workplace. And they praised the individualized attention given to students, the expertise of the faculty, and the diversity of course offerings. Typical comments regarding the strengths of the department included:
